Literature review

We see that the literature review plays an important role both in the beginning of the study and at the end of the study.

In the beginning it is important to know where is a gap between the potential new knowledge and the "old" knowledge, i.e. where exists a promising research topic and understudied research questions.

At the end it is important to know what are the implications of the study to science, i.e. are the results achieved new or are they supporting the old knowledge or are they opposite compared with the old knowledge and why.

We have different experiences based on our empirical works and our positions as advisors. We have some good and not so good examples from the literature, too.
